FEEDING

Omnivorous. Feed small sized foods, including frozen & live foods.

ADDITIONAL COMMENTS

When kept in a school, Blue-eye males put on elaborate fin displays to impress females and to outshine rival males. Best kept in planted aquaria, either in a single species tank or with other small fishes. Suitable for nano tanks, also useful for mosquito control in frog ponds where water temperatures are usually above 14C.
