Sometimes referred to as the amethystine python. Largest teeth of any python species. Quite slender, and generally olive-brown with dark brown or black bands, and a pale cream belly. Distinctive marks on the neck - large scales on top of the head. In certain angles when light catches the scales, these pythons display amethyst colours, hence the name.
